I he courageous black troops known as the Buffalo Soldiers played a vital role in taming the American West. Comprised of African-American soldiers, including Civil War veterans, the Ninth and Tenth U.S. Cavalry and the 24th and 25th U.S. Infantry regiments achieved remarkable military feats despite facing significant challenges. They received more Congressional



Medals of Honor than any other unit in the Army and had the lowest desertion rate. These remarkable soldiers not only protected wagon trains, cattle drives, and settlers but also delivered mail and guarded railroads and stagecoaches.


Their bravery and tenacity in battle earned the respect of the Cheyenne, who honored them with the nickname "Buffalo Soldiers" because of their resemblance to the revered bison and their display of strength and courage. Embracing the title with pride, they left an indelible mark

as the pioneers of excellence in the military.

The Buffalo Soldiers made history as the first AfricanAmerican soldiers to serve during peacetime, setting the stage for other milestones, including the achievements of General Colin Powell, the Tuskegee Airmen, the 761st Tank Battalion, the 555th Parachute Infantry Battalion, and the Golden Thirteen, who became the trailblazers for future generations.

In 2024, the Tenth United States Cavalry celebrated 148 years of continuous service, a testament to their unwavering commitment during both peacetime and wartime. Their legacy and contributions continue to inspire and shape the generations that follow.

n 1993, the Buffalo Soldiers Motorcycle

Club was founded, in Chicago, by Ken "Dream Maker" Thomas, to socialize men and women who shared similar ideals and the common bond of motorcycling. The name

was chosen to uphold and perpetuate the heroic legend of the original Buffalo Soldiers' and the legacy of excellence of the African American soldiers who fol-



lowed. The Chicago Chapter is now known as the Buffalo Troopers.

Today there are chapters in more than half of the states all across the country that subscribe to the Constitution and By-laws of the Buffalo Soldiers Motorcycle Club. While members love to ride and take pride in riding safely, they take equal pride in conveying a positive image, especially to youth, in their communities. BSMC's are actively committed to community service and educational programs including supporting senior citizen homes, student scholarships, and food and fund drives for charitable organizations such as the March of Dimes and Toys for Tots. The club takes a pro-active role in mentoring youth and volunteering to assist with educational programs.

Retrace 2004

At the Buffalo Soldier Monument Ground-breaking ceremony on July 28, 1990, General Colin Powell said, "... since 1641, there has never been a time in this country when Blacks were unwilling to serve and sacrifice for America." The statue, a magnificent tribute to their spirit and legacy was dedicated as a Memorial to the Buffalo Soldiers on July 28, 1992, the 126th anniversary of the day Congress authorized the creation of the Buffalo Soldier regiments.

On July 31, 2004, Buffalo Soldiers Chapters from all over the United States rode "iron horses" to attend a Commemorative, Service at the Buffalo Soldier



Monument, located at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, home of the original 10th Cavalry (Buffalo Soldiers). The experience forged a memory that will always be treasured.

In 2016, the Fort Leavenworth Chapter again hosted Soldiers from across the Nation as they rode "iron horses "to visit and pay homage to the Buffalo Soldiers once stationed Monument at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.




